A RESPONSIBLE ORGANIZATION

Throughout 2023, Funax focused its efforts on the Juárez-El Paso border region, implementing six projects that fostered creativity, initiative, and STEAM knowledge among children, youth, and adults in various institutions.

In November 2018, Funax earned CONFÍO, A.C.'s Transparency and Good Practices Accreditation Badge for the first time. Since then, it has upheld its commitment, renewing the accreditation every two years.

Digital Fabrication Training

Fab Lab Juárez is a fabrication laboratory specializing in digital technologies—a space for creating, learning, and sharing knowledge. It promotes entrepreneurship and proactive learning through the creative use of new technologies for experimentation, encouraging participation in various projects to develop skills. Throughout 2023, Fab Lab Juárez delivered 15 recurring workshops to participants aged 5 and up.

TEALS Program

(Technology, Education and Learning Support)

Education in programming languages for high school students.

Aimed at public high school students preparing to pursue technical or university education, Microsoft TEALS offers them advanced educational resources and exposure to professional opportunities in STEM fields. Currently, students are learning Python, and in the next school year, artificial intelligence topics will be incorporated, expanding this knowledge to the municipalities of Chihuahua, Nuevo Casas Grandes, Casas Grandes, Cuauhtémoc, and Juárez.

Mobile Digital Fabrication Training

In 2023, Fab Lab Móvil reached both shifts at technical middle schools, bringing technology education to students in high-risk areas of Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua. This project aims to develop knowledge and skills in teenagers, broadening their educational perspectives through workshops in programming and robotics, digital design and 3D prototyping, as well as augmented and virtual reality.

The Bridge Accelerator is an intensive, binational program, up to 12 weeks long, designed to accelerate the growth of supply chain businesses within the manufacturing industry on both sides of the border. 


