OUR COMMITMENT TO RESPONSIBILITY

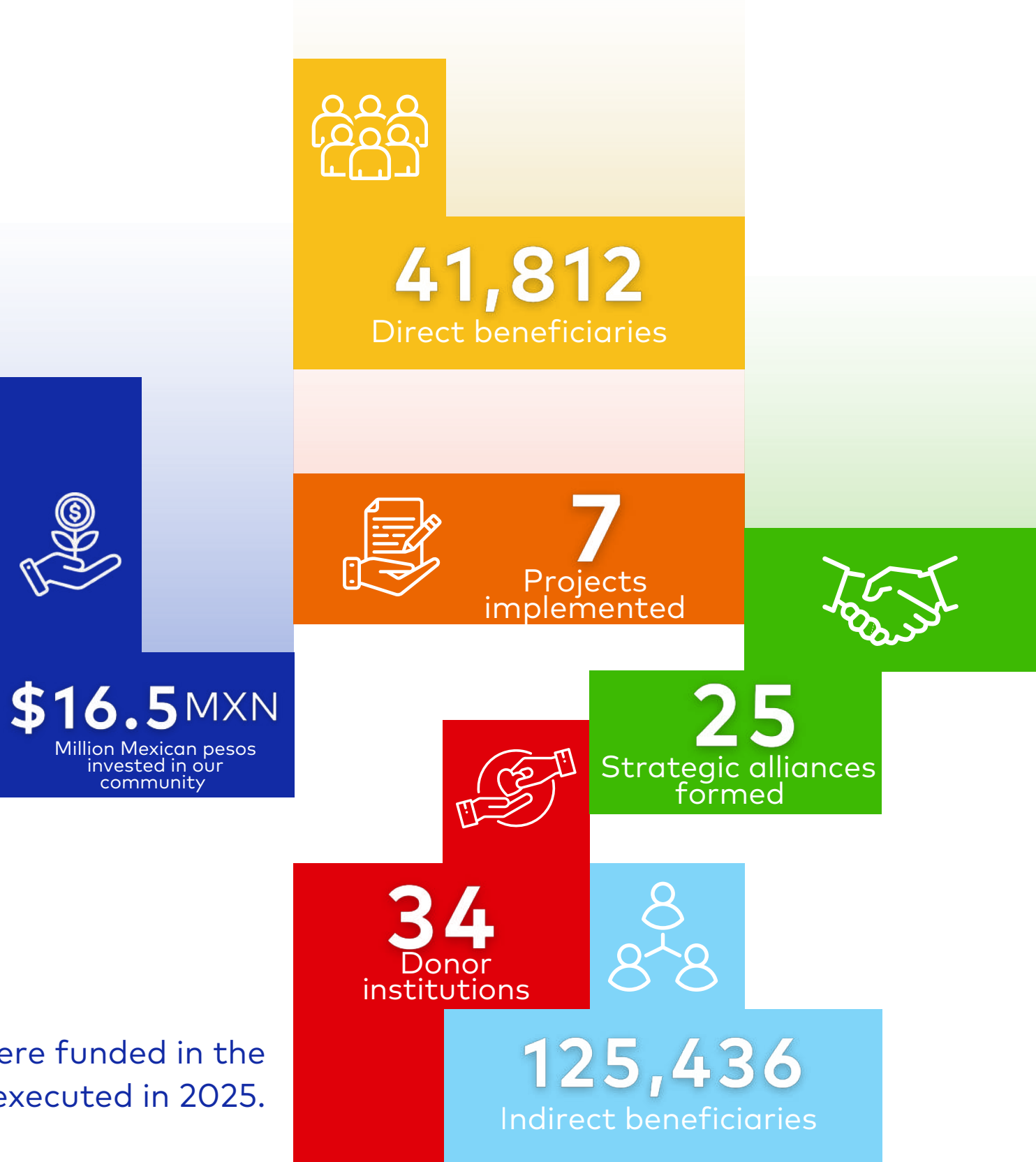

This accreditation, renewed every two years, highlights our dedication to transparency and institutional integrity. Digital Fabrication Training

Fab Lab Juárez is a fabrication laboratory specializing in digital technologies—a space for creating, learning, and sharing knowledge. It promotes entrepreneurship and proactive learning through the creative use of new technologies for experimentation, encouraging participation in various projects to develop skills. Throughout 2024, Fab Lab Juárez delivered 16 recurring workshops to participants aged 5 and up.

TEALS Program

(Technology, Education and Learning Support)

Programming Training

Through the Microsoft TEALS program, public high school students in various municipalities across Chihuahua—including Juárez, Cuauhtémoc, Chihuahua, Casas Grandes, Nuevo Casas Grandes, and Villa Ahumada — are strengthening their readiness for continued technical or university education.

In the classroom, they learn Python programming and cover artificial intelligence topics, with the support of specialized volunteers. The program provides them with access to advanced educational resources and brings them closer to professional opportunities in STEAM fields.

Mobile Digital Fabrication Training

In 2024, Fab Lab Móvil reached both shifts at technical middle schools, bringing technology education to students in high-risk areas of Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua. This project aims to develop knowledge and skills in teenagers, broadening their educational perspectives through workshops in programming and robotics, digital design, and 3D prototyping, as well as augmented and virtual reality.

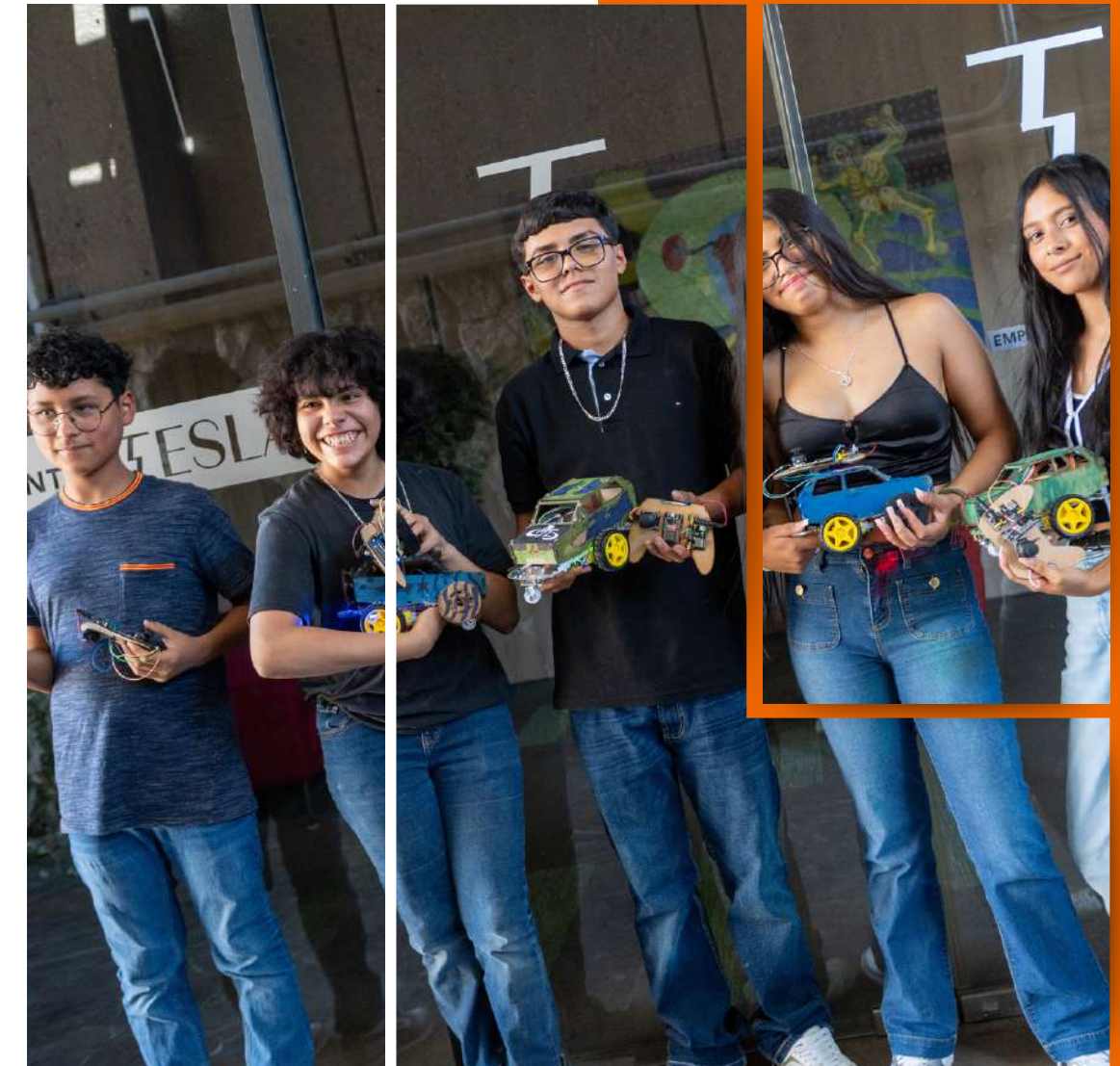

Educational and Technological Guidance for Vulnerable Groups

This educational program promotes STEAM learning for teenagers at risk of dropping out of school. Over 12 weeks, students participate in hands-on sessions where they apply science, technology, engineering, and mathematics through digital fabrication tools like 3D printers, laser cutters, and basic programming.

By focusing on teamwork, creativity, and problem-solving, Fab Lab Edu aims to spark an interest in learning, strengthen 21st-century skills, and reduce school dropout rates.

Training to Strengthen the Economy

The Bridge Accelerator is an intensive, binational program, up to 12 weeks long, designed to accelerate the growth of supply chain businesses within the manufacturing industry on both sides of the border. Its goal is to increase the participation of local companies as suppliers to large manufacturers in the binational Paso del Norte region. This specialized program is designed for companies with high growth potential and proven capabilities to become suppliers for the region's manufacturing companies.

During 2024, a strategic investment was made to develop PYMAIS, a national platform designed to provide free training and strengthen the knowledge of individuals, entrepreneurs, and business owners.

PYMAIS has a clear purpose: to prepare entrepreneurs and small businesses (SMEs) to promote actions that improve the popular economy of Mexicans. It is a tool specifically designed for those who seek to grow, scale, and connect with new business opportunities.

Igniting Entrepreneurship

Prisma Emprendedor focuses on empowering young people (ages 18-35) from the northwest area of Ciudad Juárez. The program strengthens their entrepreneurial skills to support self-employment.

In 2024, Module B of the PRISMA methodology was implemented, providing hands-on training to 15 projects in areas such as Lean Canvas, SWOT analysis, and MVP development. Through four sessions and a final pitch presentation, the program helped participants formalize their initiatives and expand their professional opportunities.

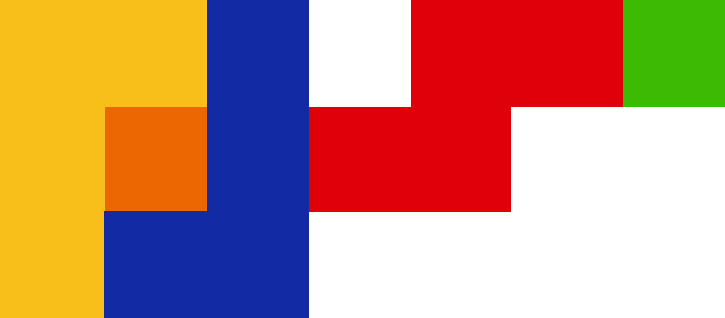
